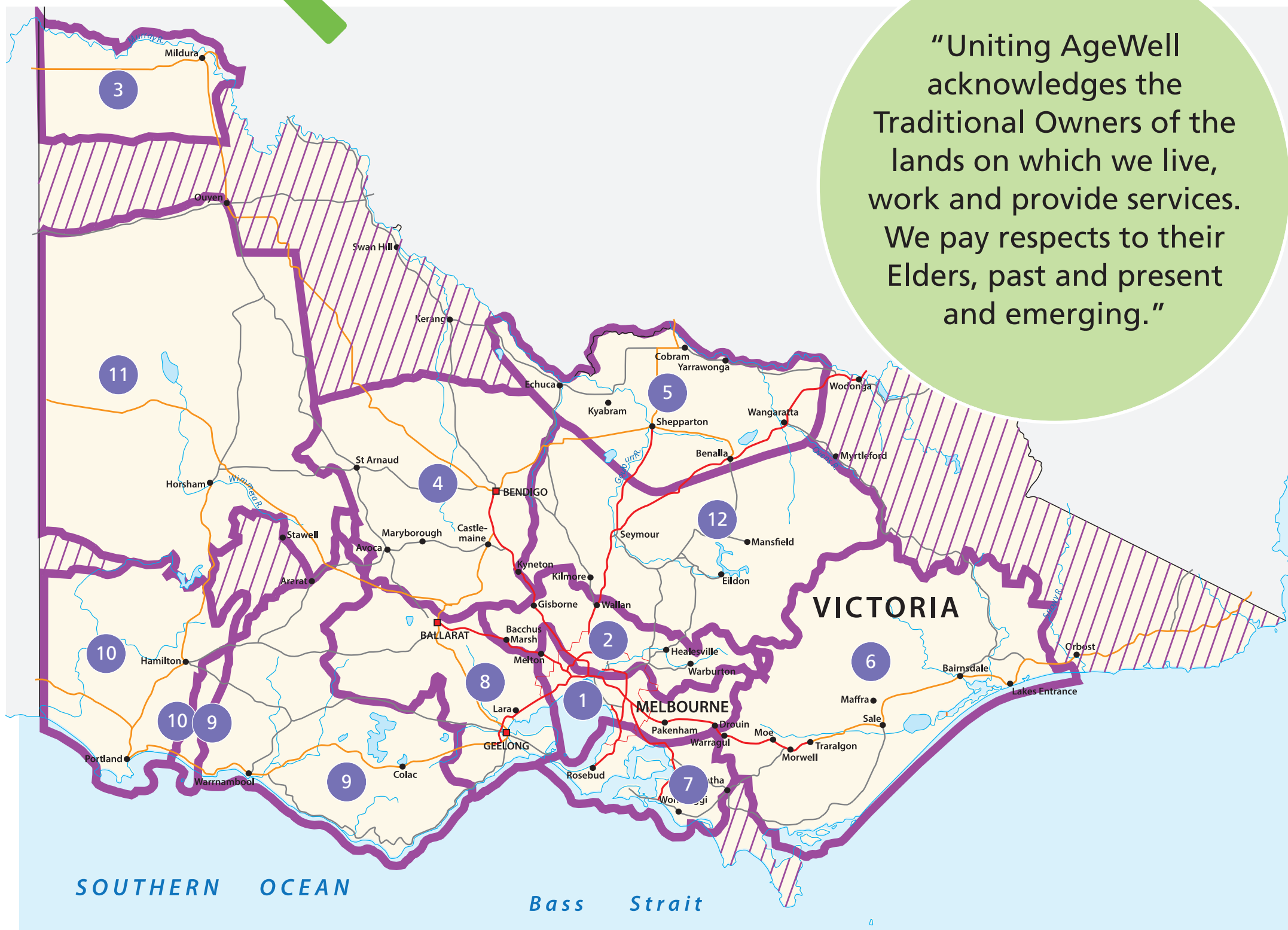




Acknowledgement of Country
